



NEWS BRIEFS

TERRITORIAL COUNCIL MEETING DECEMBER 1

A territorial council meeting has been called for Monday, December 1. On the agenda, budgetary concerns: the fourth modification of the year. And real estate: the acquisition of land in Flamand, lot AE 1763 on the cadastre, following the act of right of preemption by the Collectivity; authorization for the president to expropriate land for a public utility; and the purchase of lots AI 202 and AI 69 in Saint Jean, near the airport; purchase of lots AI 240, AI 678, and AI 680; and the appropriation of land in Colombier along territorial route 1. In terms of administrative affairs, naming of the EHPAD; and finally an apartment for the manager of the new bungalows soon to be open in the sports complex in Saint Jean.

A VILLAGE FOR CHRISTMAS



As the holidays approach, the island is preparing for its year-end celebration. To illuminate Gustavia, the Collectivity has decided to set a new benchmark with a special show by the experts at Blachère Illumination. Their work is

acclaimed around the world, such as in Paris, especially at the Eiffel Tower and the Champs-Élysées. And once again this year the tourism committee (CTTSB) will organize a Christmas village on the Quai du Général de Gaulle, open from Saturday, December 13 to Sunday, December 21, including the traditional visit by Santa Claus on December 14. There will also be surprise guests, according to the CTTSB, who also hope to have more activities for kids at the village this year. Along with a varied program of events throughout the week culminating with a gospel concert the last day.

BIG CLEAN UP ON NOVEMBER 30



Put on your gardening gloves and get out your trash bags! The Lions Club and the Rotary Club of Saint Barthélemy have organized a giant clean up day on Sunday, November 30. Avec Saint Jean. Gloves and trash bags will be made available to those who don't bring their own, as well as bottles of water and croissants, and a BBQ will be held at the end of the day for all participants. "The art of being an island should not just be empty words, but a real engagement for each of the residents," says Amande Hahn and Abigail Leese, the presidents of the Lions and Rotary clubs. "Tourism is the primary economic resource of our island. As such, our visitors deserve our best attention. And the cleanliness of the island is a way to respect them," add the presidents of the service clubs. "Especially as we live in an exceptionally beautiful natural environment, on an island that many people envy. We should have the intelligence and sensitivity to preserve it." This year, the organizers of the clean up hope to attract a larger crowd to help, and to beat the record for the amount of trash collected and brought to the incinerator in Public. The Rotary Club is counting on the support of its Early Act and Inter Act groups, recently opened for students at the primary school in Gustavia and the middle school. They hope to get young people to support the cause. Last year, a total of no less than 4.3 tons of trash of all sorts was collected.

VETERANS IN THE SPOTLIGHT



The Veterans of Foreign Wars association, and its president Lucien Couic, did a great job with a sound and light show honoring the soldiers from Saint Barth who fought in World War I. Held on Saturday, November 15, the event drew several hundred people to the war memorial in Gustavia for a presentation about the soldiers from Saint Barth who died for the glory of France during the war of 1914-1918. The Chorale de Bons Chœurs also performed, and fireworks were set off Fort Oscar.



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ANTOINE QUESTEL FINISHES SEASON 15TH WORLDWIDE AND SECOND IN FRANCE

In slalom racing, Saint Barth-born windsurfer Antoine Questel finished tenth in the PWA World Windsurfing Tour championships held November 18-23 in New Caledonia. Over the course of the nine races in the Airwaves Noumea Dream Cup, Dutchman Ben Van Der Steen took first place ahead of top French racers Antoine Albeau and Cyril Moussilmani, who took second and third place respectively. This second place in New Caledonia allowed Albeau to win his 22nd world championship title at the end of the season— 20 years after winning his first world title in slalom, the Frenchman is still a force in windsurfing. It has also been 20 years since New Caledonia hosted a world championship event, and this one in Noumea lived up to its expectations.



This year, it was clear that France dominated the discipline. In the overall ratings, two of Antoine Albeau's fellow Frenchmen took second and third place on the podium respectively: Cyril Moussilmani and Pierre Mortefon. Questel finished in 10th place, taking advantage of the last leg of the championships in New Caledonia to climb two spots higher in the overall ratings and putting in his best performance of the season, finishing 15th worldwide.

Questel, on the other hand, shared the joy of his girlfriend Delphine Cousin, who won her second consecutive world championship thanks to her top performance in New Caledonia. Lena Erdil from Turkey and Valérie Ghibaudo from France, finished the season n°2 and n°3 worldwide. Cousin had a great season overall, as two weeks ago she had already been crowned women's champion of France for slalom in Carnac, in Brittany. Winner of this Breton event, Questel, double winner of the title, finished the French championships in second place, behind Pierre Mortefon.

ORANGE, OFFICIAL PARTNER OF THE SAINT-BARTH FUN CUP



For the 2015 edition of the Saint-Barth Fun Cup, January 29-February 1, telecommunications company Orange has joined the list of official sponsors for the competition, along with St Barth French West Indies, Allianz, Ulysse Nardin, and the Collectivity of Saint Barthélemy. The new sponsor will fit right in, as orange has been the color selected by the organizers for the past two years for the race village on the beach and the racers out on the turquoise waters. 80 competitors are expected for this fourth edition of the Fun Cup, a spirited windsurfing regatta, including some of the heavyweights in the sport, notably world champion Delphine Cousin. On his home turf of Saint Barth, Antoine Questel serves as co-organizer of the Fun Cup, and will certainly be on the starting line to defend his current title. WEATHER

OCTOBER WAS HOT AND MARKED BY GONZALO

The month of October was marked by the passage of Gonzalo, first announced as a simple tropical storm but hitting the island with hurricane-force winds. In spite of the hurricane, the amount of rainfall measured in Gustavia, "or 4 inches was less than the average of 5.3 inches," indicates Yannick Gréaux and Lucien Louis, of Espace Météo Caraïbes. Moderately rainy, the month of October was hotter than usual however, with an average temperature of 83.6°F, higher than the norm of 82.9°F. The thermometer hit 92.3°F on October 4, with a low of 73.2°F on the 13th (the day that Gonzalo hit). Other than during the hurricane, the winds were moderate last month, predominantly from the east, yet periodically from the south or southeast. On October 13, during hurricane Gonzalo, the wind unusually came from the north, then west, with gusts from the northwest measured in Gustavia as high as 126 mph. Average winds from the southwest that day hit 77 mph. "These averages are a new record for the month of October, based on data collected since 1959," add Gréaux and Louis.

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Lagravière Storms Saint Barth

Morgan Lagravière and Arnaud Jarlegan (Architectonik) took top honors in the Saint-Barth Cata Cup, as first-time participants in the event. The two sailors are specialists in offshore racing, giving them an advantage in battling the challenging weather conditions during the four days of racing: conditions that made it impossible to race on Sunday. Franck Cammas and Matthieu Vandame (ODP1) and Billy

Besson and Marie Riou (Nikki Beach) complete the podium.

Morgan Lagravière and Arnaud Jarlegan (Architectonik) won the Saint-Barth Cata Cup in their first appearance in this popular regatta for the F18 class. Specialists in offshore racing on the Imoca circuit with the Safran team, Lagravière and his teammate Jarlegan, were the best equipped to deal with the

strong weather that complicated the four days of racing, with gusts of wind reaching as high as 30 knots, and high seas with two-meter swells.

phy, winning one race and placing second in the two races of the day. Lagravière and Jarlegan and Mike Easton and Matthew Whitehead (REMAX4), also first-timers at the Cata Cup, completed Thursday's winners circle.

These two sailors dominated this 7th edition of the regatta, dueling for first place with Franck Cammas and Matthieu Vandame (ODP1), last year's winners of the Cata Cup. Cammas and Vandame had the best start on Thursday, November 20, winning the Design Affairs Tro-

With bad weather expected on Saturday, the race organized moved the challenging tour around the island to Friday morning. In this race, Lagravière and Jarlegan (Architectonik)

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displayed their talent, winning the race ahead of Cammas and Vandame, who then won the second race in the afternoon by a nose, as they battled the winds. With their victory in the tour around the island having a higher coefficient, Lagravière and Jarlegan won the Allianz Saint-Barth Assurances Trophy as awarded on Friday. Cammas and Vandame took second place, while Nacra 17 world champions Billy Besson and Marie Riou (Nikki Beach) snuck in for third place.

On Saturday, the weather was bad as expected, with gusts of wind as high 30 knots rounding the point of Colombier, which forced the organizers to limit the competition to the bay of Saint Jean, with just one race in the afternoon around the outlying islands of Toc-Verts and Bonhomme. As masters of maxi multi-hulls, Cammas and Lagravière, once again dueling toward the finish, with Cata Cup first-timer Lagravière winning Cammas and Vandame had capsized, yet managed to get back in the saddle to take second place. Lagravière and Jarlegan thus won the RE/MAX Trophy on Saturday, with Frédéric Duthil et Frédéric Moreau (Marché U) in third place on the podium. Also worth noting is the impressive fourth place performance by Canadians Anthony Boueilh and Maxime Loiselle (Filles des Iles), while at least 10 other boats abandoned on Saturday afternoon.

On Sunday, the Marché U trophy could not be awarded, as the organizers preferred to take a prudent stance in face of the weather and cancel the race. Better to avoid damage to the boats after a tentative start in the bay of Saint Jean, at which time almost a dozen boats overturned in just a few minutes. At the end of this 7th edition, Morgan Lagravière and Arnaud Jarlegan had added their names to the winners of the Cata Cup, as these skippers from team Safran enjoyed their success in Saint Barth. In April, Lagravière's partner on team Safran, Gwenolé Gahinet— sailing with Paul Meilhat — won the Transat Ag2r La Mondiale, a transatlantic race from Concarneau to Saint-Barth.

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





Saint Barth is now orbiting the same sphere as Art Basel, which holds one of its large international art fairs in Miami in early December each year. For the past several years, art mogul Larry Gagosian has partnered with Eden Rock Gallery to present several of his artists on the island for a week or so around the holidays in the aim of connecting with the high-season clientele. This year also draws the celebrat-

ed Perrotin gallery, an international name with branches in Paris, New York and Hong Kong. Eden Rock Gallery, and the association Art Saint-Barth led by Jenny Mannerheim and Philippe Combres, has convinced Emmanuel Perrotin and his artist Kaws, already a regular in Saint Barth, having vacationed on the island for several years, to present his brand new work. This exhibit, which runs from Friday, November 28 through December 25, takes place at Eden Rock Gallery, inaugurating a new space that the hotel is dedicating to art. The new Eden Rock Gallery is perched on the rock with a stunning view of the ocean, replacing the former lobby area, which has now moved to the ground floor.

The story of Kaws, whose real name is Brian Donnelly, is a tale of success from the New York art scene. Born in 1974 in Brooklyn, he started in the street as a graffiti artist, armed only with cans of spray paint. Encouraged by other street artists such as Futura 2000 and Banksy, Kaws' work then moved to the walls of a gallery. He graduated from the School of Visual Arts in NYC, and once worked as an animator for Disney.

In a Pop Art-esque style, Kaws reworks comic book icons and characters such as The Simpsons, Peanuts (Snoopy), and Sponge Bob, turning them into thought-provoking works of art. His work inspires musicians and fashion designers, and Kaws recently col-

laborated with his producer friend Pharrell Williams, creating the bottle design for "Girl," a perfume for Comme des Garçons.

One of Kaws' paintings at Eden Rock Gallery takes the form of a dolphin, designed in the style of comic book characters in bright

colors with a highly saturated palette. Entitled Permanent Vacation, this painting lends its name to the exhibit, and the name evokes the first feature film by Jim Jarmusch, about a drifter lost in an existential void. However, this permanent vacation is more than an ode to idleness.

For the first time, during this exhibit at Eden Rock Gallery, the artist will exhibit his monochrome work, inspired by the famous Peanuts characters created by Charles M. Schulz. Eden Rock will also be showing the faux palm tree sculpture made by artist Douglas White, in place on the beach at Saint Jean, miraculously saved after hurricane Gonzalo. The Eden Rock will also serve as an open-air gallery, showcasing among other works the poetry of Robert Montgomery on the outside walls.

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

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
