# A FESTIVAL OF CARIBBEAN MUSIC

The curtain goes up on the 11th annual SB Jam Musik Festival on Thursday, July 14. Three evenings of free concerts on the dock in Gustavia through Saturday, with a great line-up of musicians once again this year.



Starting on July 14, the French national holiday Bastille Day, Caribbean music will be in the spotlight during the 11th annual SB Jam Musik Festival, on the main dock in Gustavia. Three evenings of free concerts with a top-notch line up of performers, thanks to the efforts of the association SB Jam and the hard-working festival organizer, Jackson Questel.

Thursday, the July 14 program features **Kalash** from Martinique, whose first album came out in May, confirming his place as the next generation of urban Caribbean music, hip-hop, and dancehall. **Youth Waves** from Saint Martin opens

the show, starting at 8:30pm. The evening also comprises the traditional Bastille Day fireworks.

On Friday evening, July 15, **Dominik Coco** takes center stage. This star of zouk, former singer from the group, Volt Face, and fervent champion of Creole culture is popular throughout the islands. As a solo performer, Dominik Coco forged a new musical style, which he calls Kako Music. He will be followed by **Capleton**, another heavy

weight star and dancehall icon. Born in 1967 in Islington, Capleton emerged on the Jamaican music scene at the age of 18. He met with international success when his first album, *Prophecy*, came out 10 years later, in 1995. Capleton then signed with Def Jam, the label created by hip-hop producer Russell Simmons. As a result, some of the best rappers—Method Man, Wu-Tang Clan, Q-Tip, A Tribe Called Quest—performed on his subsequent albums. He then decided to get back to his roots and seek spirituality in the Rastafari culture. On his most recent single, *Bun Dem Down*, released in 2013, Capleton did not lose any of his verve. Nor

the timbre of his voice, carried along on his syncopated rhythms.

On Saturday, July 16, the group **Kadanse** from Saint Barth will be the opening act, followed by **Alison Hinds**, a British-born singer based in Barbados, and the queen of soca. This promises to be quite an evening and quite an incredible three-day tribute to Caribbean music!

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## News Briefs

### TRAFFIC PATTERN MODIFIED ON RUE DU GÉNÉRAL DE GAULLE

Major roadwork is underway on Rue Oscar II in Gustavia. The first phase entails placing such things as new water pipes and telecommunications cables underground, and to install a rainwater collection system in the middle of the roadway. In order for this work to take place, traffic is now moving in the opposite direction than usual on Rue du Général de Gaulle, which is the temporary way to head out of the center of Gustavia toward the dispensary or the commercial port. Be careful if driving on the perpendicular streets when you reach Rue du Général de Gaulle. Do not turn right as usual: it is now necessary to turn left (toward Le Select).

### THE COLLECTIVITÉ OBTAINS A MARIANNE D'OR FOR DURABLE DEVELOPMENT

Created as part of "Grenelle de l'environnement," the Marianne d'Or for sustainable development recognizes such policies enacted by local governments. These awards are presented in partnership with Eco Emballages. In addition to Bruno Magras, 20 additional politicians—mayors, deputy mayors, and presidents of agglomerated communities—were so honored, along with certain businesses and individuals.

## SIX GUARDS OF THE RÉSERVE SERVE AS ENVIRONMENTAL POLICE



Warning to scofflaws in the Réserve de Saint-Barthélemy! Existing rules will be more strictly enforced in the future, since six guards of the island's Environmental Agency have been trained as environmental police. In order to issue citations for infractions in the field, they still have to be commissioned by the Collectivité, then sworn-in by the public prosecutor. After that, these six guards can proudly display the tri-color, red, white, and blue, badge of the environment police on their shirts, and more importantly they will be able to issue citations that are likely to be followed up in court before a judge. "The rules in the Réserve are generally respected," observes Olivier Raynaud, director of the Territorial Environmental Agency. Even if "certain individuals and businesses don't respect them, and don't make a secret of it," regrets Raynaud. Once they are sworn-in, the guards can give tickets of 135 Euros for infractions. Whether for using "a Seabob in the Réserve," unauthorized mooring, or illegal fishing, according to Raynaud. The fine goes up to 375 Euros if not paid on time.

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## SEISMIC STATION INSTALLED IN ANSE DES CAYES



The Volcanic and Seismic Observatory of Guadeloupe (OVSG) has installed a seismic station in Saint Barth. On May 17-20, a team from the OVSG, led by André Anglade, came to the island to install the needed equipment for this station on a piece of land acquired by the Collectivité in Anse des Cayes.

This includes two sensors: one to measure the vibrations on the ground; and the second, an accelerometer to measure the speed that the seismic waves accelerate. There is also a machine to record the data collected, which is transmitted by satellite to the three seismic observatories in the Lesser Antilles. "In Guadeloupe, in Martinique, and in Trinidad, the three observatories receive the data simultaneously," explains Céline Dessert, director of the OVSG. The goal is a better understanding of the frequent seismic activity in the Caribbean region, and "additional islands are committed to installing the same type of seismic stations, with the satellite relay," says Dessert. In the northern Antilles, there is already a station in Saint Kitts and another in Sint Maarten. "Otherwise we would be missing information," Dessert adds. This new station, financed in part by European funds, "plays both a scientific role and an operational role at the same time." It will also serve as an alert for an impending tsunami. This information is sent to Hawaii, which centralizes such data, as well as to islands or countries concerned by the alert, so that they can get their population to safe ground. The OVSG also hopes to install a tidal gauge in Saint Barth that will measure the height of the waves. This instrument will also be useful in the event of a tsunami.



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# THE SAINT JEAN SALT POND TO BE OPEN TO THE SEA



**When the Territorial Council met on May 13, they authorized the president of the Collectivité to sign a sponsorship agreement with the Eden Rock to open the salt pond in Saint Jean. The hotel will create a system of four underground pipes that will permanently open the pond to the sea.**

**T**here was much discussion on the subject as several of the council members are afraid of putting the cart before the horse in terms of this project. The goal is to restore the salt pond in Saint Jean, which is polluted, filled with silt, and asphyxiating. It is also a source of foul odors that empoison the lives of those who live around the pond, not to mention the clients at the nearby Eden Rock hotel. To remedy the situation, the Collectivité is ready to sign a sponsorship agreement naming Eden Rock Real Estate as the project manager for the creation of the four subterranean pipelines.

Almost 500 feet in length (150m), the pipes will open the salt pond to the sea in a perma-

nent manner. The pipes will empty into the ocean, just before the large rocky promontory where Eden Rock is located. 20 inches (50cm) wide, the four pipes provide a combined opening of six feet (two meters). The hotel will finance the installation of the pipes; a project evaluated at one million euros.

At the same time, the Collectivité has put aside 2.5 million euros in its budget for the clean up, dredging, consolidation of the pond's banks, as well as replanting of mangroves. What is the timeline for all this? Bruno Magras persuaded the council that there is no time to lose, as to not lose the donation from the hotel—as well as the expertise of an American company that could only do the

work as part of a private contract. Magras indicated “the work could rapidly take place during the low season.”

In vain, several of his colleagues asked him to take more time to do more in-depth studies on the water currents in the bay of Saint Jean. In order to make sure that the waste that comes from the pipes would be carried out to sea, and not toward the beach, at the risk of polluting the bay and endangering the quality of the water for swimming.

“If the salt pond is opened to the sea, would you swim in the bay of Saint Jean?” Benoit Chauvin asked Bruno Magras. “Me, I would not swim there,” averred Chauvin, the opposition candi-




date of Tous Pour Saint-Barth, who leads the island’s environmental commission. He pointed out the risk that polluted water could stagnate to the right of Eden Rock, which is already the case “with sargassum seaweed that does not go away.”

Chauvin would prefer to proceed with caution, as he says: “we do things backwards. First the pond should be treated and cleaned up, as well as deal with the pollution that enters the pond. Over a period of three or four years, to verify that the wastewater entering the pond has been treated. If we open the pond to the sea, we would have insurance that it will not be harmful,” he justifies. “The council is not irresponsible,” objects Magras. “We do not

have the intention of polluting the bay, when we know how important the beaches are for our economic health. That is certain-

ly the case for Eden Rock, which has no interest in destroying its business,” insists the president of the Collectivité. He promises that analyses will be done to ensure the quality of the wastewater. And that a series of valves can be used to “interrupt the flow” at any time is any pollution is apparent.



**SAINT JEAN SALT POND:  
APPEAL BY ST BARTH ESSENTIEL**

Worried about the risk of pollution in the bay, since the quality of the purity of the water in the salt pond is not always ensured, the association St Barth Essentiel has asked the president of the Collectivité to cancel the decision made by the territorial council on May 13. They think that the information the council members were given on this dossier “was insufficient,” and without have an impact study done, this environmental protection association has also asked that the prefect for St Barth conduct a control of legality on this deliberation.



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# A GASTRONOMY FESTIVAL TO KICK OFF THE SEASON

The third edition of the St Barth Gourmet Festival takes place on November 3-6, 2016, with more guests chefs than in the past—a total of nine—hosted by partnering restaurants. The goal of the event is to get the tourist season up and running even earlier.

The third edition of the St Barth Gourmet Festival, designed to promote the island as a great place to enjoy fine dining, takes place on November 3-6, 2016. The Tourism Committee (CTTSB), organizer of the event, has announced that the patron chef for this third edition is **Christian Le Squer**, who earned three stars from Michelin for his restaurant Le Cinq, at the Four Seasons Hotel George V in Paris. Squer follows in the footsteps of Emmanuel Renaut last year's patron chef.

The principle of the festival: to invite talented chefs to work in the kitchens of the partnering restaurants on the island.

Each chef creates a gourmet menu, served as four or eight courses, presenting guests with a wide range of culinary styles and signature dishes.

This year, eight chefs, in addition to Christian Le Squer, have been invited to present the best of French gastronomy. **Arnaud Donckele**, three-star chef at La Vague d'Or at the Résidence de la Pinède (Saint Tropez), will be the guest chef at the Hotel Cheval Blanc. Le Barthélemy Hotel will host two-star chef **Guy Martin** from Le Grand Véfour (Paris). **Sylvestre Wahid**, two-star chef at Sylvestre at the Thoumieux Hotel (Paris), will be the guest chef at the Hotel Christo-

Le Guanhani Hotel will host **Fabien Lefebvre**, one-star chef at Octopus (Béziers). **Christophe Saintagne**, chef at Papillon (Paris), will be at the Taiwana Hotel. Desserts will also be in the spot-

light with pastry chef **Gilles Marchal**, guest at La Plage at Tom Beach Hotel.

"It is an honor to welcome such talented chefs to our island," notes Nils Dufau, president of the Territorial Tourism Committee of Saint Barthélemy. "The Saint Barth Gourmet Festival is a major event that helps confirm the dominant position of the island as a world-class tourist destination in the Caribbean, while allowing guests and residents of the island to enjoy the best of French gastronomy in a friendly, festive ambiance that conveys the spirit of Saint Barth!"
